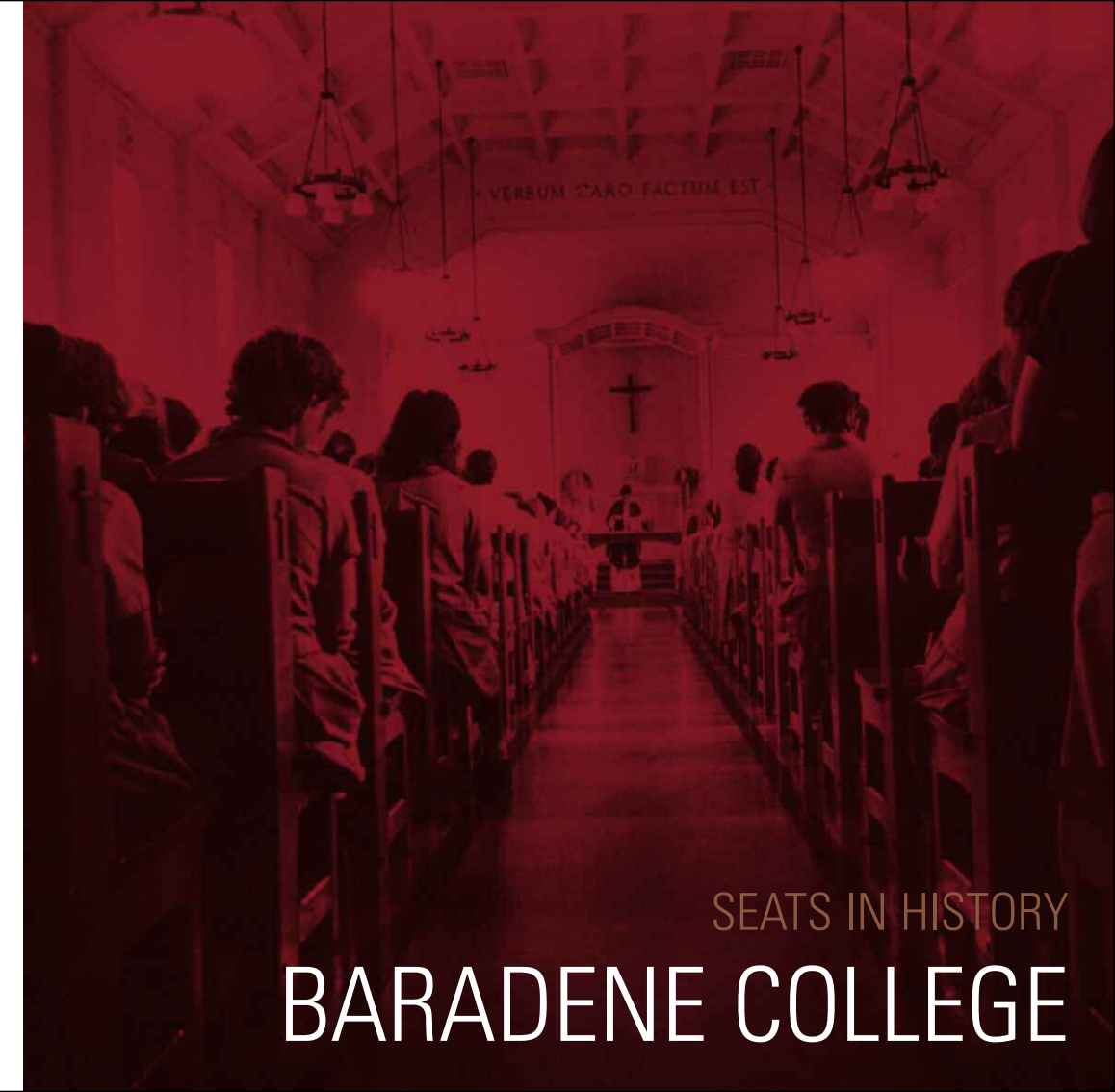

BARADENE COLLEGE

1910



The very first Mass at Baradene was celebrated in Mitchelson House in a tiny improvised chapel in St Dorothy's on New Years Day 1910.

1959



The Duchesne building completed the following year included a new chapel for the school, located in the area now occupied by the McKinstry Library. This chapel was used until 1959 when the Jubilee wing was built.

Designed by architect George Tole - the high ceiling chapel in the Jubilee Wing could seat 600, essential for a school which had grown from just 48 pupils in 1910 to over 300 in 1959. The first Mass in the Jubilee Wing Chapel was offered by Archbishop, the Most Rev. James Liston on Sunday 6th December 1959.
